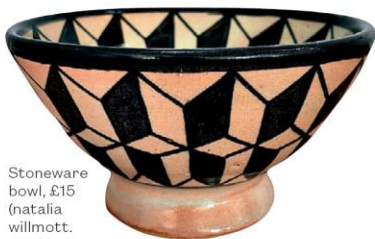
## GRAPHIC CONTENT
